Use a table to explicated list all items that will need to be purchased and the costs associated with each item. Do not forget estimates on any associated manufacturing or printing costs. While not necessary, consider juxtaposing the plans for the project with and without additional funding, including the associated costs with each.

When writing the proposal, also consider the attached judging rubric. Judges will consider 5 categories including product development approach, market potential, presentation, originality, and criticality/ROI. Please be sure to address each of these categories in the proposal.
