




The Schedule of Classes is where you can view courses being offered for the upcoming semester. If you are looking for a course not listed, please contact your graduate program director to see if it will be added to the schedule.





Talk to Your Advisor!

The most important thing you can do as a graduate student is keep in contact with your advisor!

Who is my advisor?

For a master's student, your advisor is your graduate program director.

For a doctoral student, your advisor is your PI (principal investigator).

There are two places to find the curriculum for your program.

- The first is the VCU Bulletin: bulletin.vcu.edu
- The second is your Degree Audit. See the next slide



Degree Audit

The official definition: "Degree Works is a web-based degree audit tool that helps students and advisors monitor progress toward degree completion. It produces an easy-to-read report that outlines the general education, major, ancillary requirements and electives for a student's degree program, and tracks the student's progress in completing those requirements."

For you: It's the best place to go! You can see what courses you need to take for your program, what your current GPA is, how your courses are slotting and where you need to chat with your advisor about a course that's not slotting.

Please be aware of add/drop dates on the academic calendar. You cannot add or drop a course without additional administrative paperwork once the add/drop date has passed.

Step-by-step <u>instructions</u> Register for classes

- 1. Log onto **eServices**.
- 2. Select the Students tab.
- 3. Scroll to the Student-Registration Section.
- 4. Click on Register for Classes.
- 5. Select the term for which you'd like to register and click continue.
- 6. Enter your search criteria. You may search by subject and any other search options of your choice. All the
 - classes that match your criteria will be displayed.
- 7. Click Add for the class for which you would like to register. The class will be displayed in your schedule.
 - ** Note that you are not yet registered for the class.**
- 8. Go to the Summary section on the bottom right. The class(es) will be listed as pending.
- 9. Click submit to attempt to register for the class(es).

Understanding the cost to attend

Educational expenses

- Tuition and fees see what fees include
- Health insurance see <u>VCU insurance plan pricing</u>
 - Enrollment in VCU student health insurance is **automatic** for all eligible, which includes full-time PhD and international students on F- and J-visas.
 - **Take action** every fall + spring during the "open enrollment" period to <u>enroll</u> and pay the insurance premium or to <u>opt-out</u> of the semester's coverage.

Living expenses

- · Housing: rent, utilities
- Meals: groceries, campus meal plan
- Other: supplies, books, transportation, entertainment & other essentials





What's on a billing statement


- Tuition, fees, VCU health insurance premiums, as well as on-campus housing and/or meal plan charges.
- The payment deadline is listed on the billing statement and in the email. Pay on time to avoid a late fee or hold.

Billing process:

- Charges are based on the number of registered credits
- Statements are issued by email. See <u>billing schedule</u>.
- "Health Insurance Premium" fees are separate and in addition to the "Health Fee." <u>Learn more</u>.
- Pay using <u>eServices</u>. An <u>installment payment plan</u> is available to spread out payments (for a fee).

Full-time vs. Part-time:

- 9–15 credits (full-time): billed as a flat rate
- 1-8 credits (part-time): billed by the credit hour
 - Virginia residents earn in-state rates
 - Non-resident and international M.S. students automatically earn GEIP reduced tuition rates





PhD students with an assistantship award

- Review your signed award letter regularly for details regarding assistantship funding and requirements.
- Tuition and mandatory fees support will process over the first few weeks of a semester. Note: You will still receive billing statement emails during this time.
- Pay your health insurance premium: Insurance costs are <u>not covered</u> by college assistantships. Your billing statement will list a "Health Insurance Premium" fee you must pay every fall and spring. If you opt-out (i.e., you already have insurance), a waiver will appear.
- **Keep in touch** with your advisor and program director.
- **Be alert to emails** from the Office of Graduate Studies (OGS), Human Resources (HR), or other VCU offices regarding your assistantship position.


