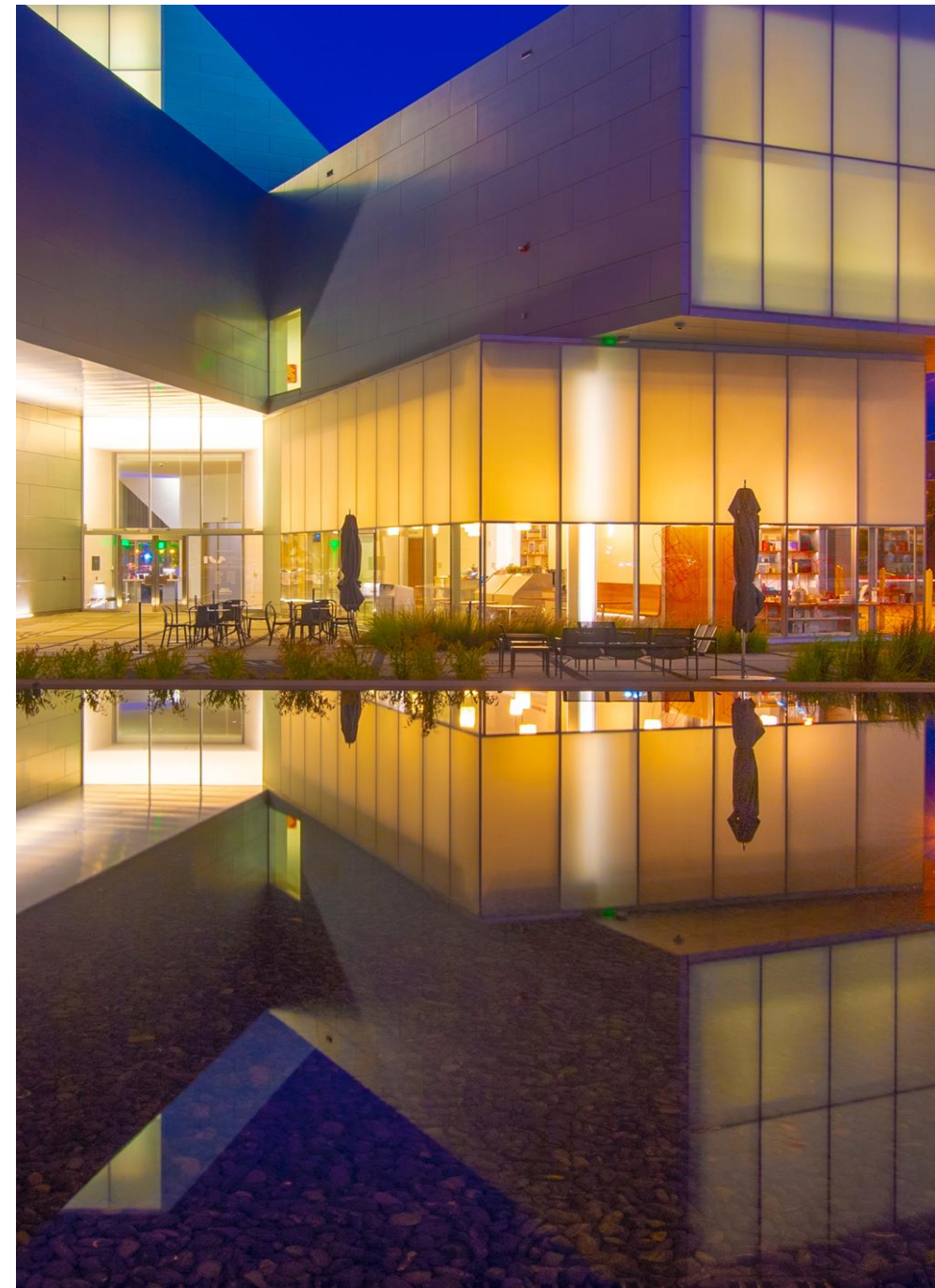

# Obtain a Form I-20

- Following your admission, contact Immigration Services to obtain a Form I-20, [Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Status](#).
- You will need the I-20 to apply for an F-1 visa and schedule a visa interview at a U.S. embassy/consulate where you live.
- To receive an I-20, you must submit the following documents to [geois@vcu.edu](mailto:geois@vcu.edu):

# Apply for the F-1 Visa

- 1. Pay the SEVIS I-901 Fee.** Visit [www.fmjfee.com](http://www.fmjfee.com) for payment instructions.
- 2. Complete the online Nonimmigrant Visa Application** (Form DS-160). Visit the [U.S. Department of State](http://U.S. Department of State) website to access Form DS-160, pay the required DS-160 fee, and upload the required personal photograph.
- 3. Schedule your visa interview.** Your visa interview should be scheduled at a U.S. Embassy or Consulate in the country where you live. A list of U.S. embassies and consulates can be found on the [U.S. Department of State](http://U.S. Department of State) website. This website also contains a specific list of the items that should be taken with you to your interview.
- 4. Prepare for your interview.**

# Understanding Visa Validity

When scheduling the timing of your visa interview and preparing to travel to the U.S., it is important to understand: (1) the validity period of your F-1 visa and (2) the number of entries permitted with that visa.

- Go to the Department of State [visa reciprocity webpage](#)
- Select the first letter of your country of citizenship
- Choose the country name from the dropdown
- On the next page, select the letter “F” for F-1 visa.
- View the specifics related to the validity period of the visa and the number of entries permitted

**Your visa interview must be scheduled so that you have enough time to enter the U.S. before your visa expires - this is especially important for students with short visa validity periods or with only one entry per visa.**

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**Explanation of Terms**

**Visa Classification:** The type of nonimmigrant visa you are applying for.

**Fee:** The reciprocity fee, also known as the visa issuance fee, you must pay. This fee is in addition to the nonimmigrant visa application fee (MRV fee).

**Number of Entries:** The number of times you may seek entry into the United States with that visa. "M" means multiple times. If there is a number, such as "One", you may apply for entry one time with that visa.

**Validity Period:** This generally means the visa is valid, or can be used, from the date it is issued until the date it expires, for travel with that visa. If your Validity Period is 60 months, your visa will be valid for 60 months from the date it is issued.

## **Additional Tips:**

- You must be able to articulate why you chose VCU (as opposed to another academic institution). What about VCU stands out to you?
- Be prepared to discuss why you have chosen your degree program and articulate your academic goals. Consider how this program will be connected to your current/future career.
- Be truthful and only answer what is asked of you. Do not preemptively offer additional details.
- Be organized. Have your documents neatly ordered in a folder or small case to easily access if the visa officer requests them.
- Consider your image. Are you making a positive impression? This includes how you choose to present yourself on social media and other public platforms that can be viewed by visa officers.

# Enhanced Social Media Vetting

- New and returning visa applicants will be subject to enhanced vetting, including review of their social media accounts
- While under review, your application may be initially “refused” under INA 221(g) - [administrative processing](#).
- Visa officers may ask you to set all your social media accounts to “public” to facilitate this review.
- Note that any derogatory information discovered by the Department of State during this review can be used as grounds for inadmissibility.
- There is no estimated timeline for completion of the review process.



# Suspension of Visa Issuance (Travel Bans)

- Fully suspended visa issuance, or
- Partially suspending visa issuance, but the suspension includes F, J and M visas
- Does not impact current visas

Visa applicants who are subject to these Presidential Proclamations may still submit visa applications and schedule interviews, but they may be ineligible for visa issuance or admission to the U.S.

# Visa Processing

- VCU is unable to contact the embassy/consulate on your behalf or expedite your visa processing.
- Processing times are determined by a number of factors that are out of our control, including the number of visa applicants in your city and the time of year.
- Visa appointment times are often released in batches. It is important that you schedule the first available appointment date, no matter how far out. New appointment dates may be released or someone may cancel and you will be moved up in the queue. You can also try a nearby city for appointments. **KEEP TRYING!**



# Visa Processing

- **Emergency/Expedited Appointment Requests.** If you are within a few weeks of the Program Start Date on your I-20 and have been unable to secure an appointment, you do have the option to request an emergency/expedited appointment. You must reserve the next available appointment date **BEFORE** contacting the embassy or consulate to consider your request.
- **Deferral of Your Program Start Date.** Please contact your academic department to **request deferral of your admission if you are unable to arrive by the start of classes on August 18th.**
- Following your deferral, you must obtain a new I-20 from GEO Immigration Services.

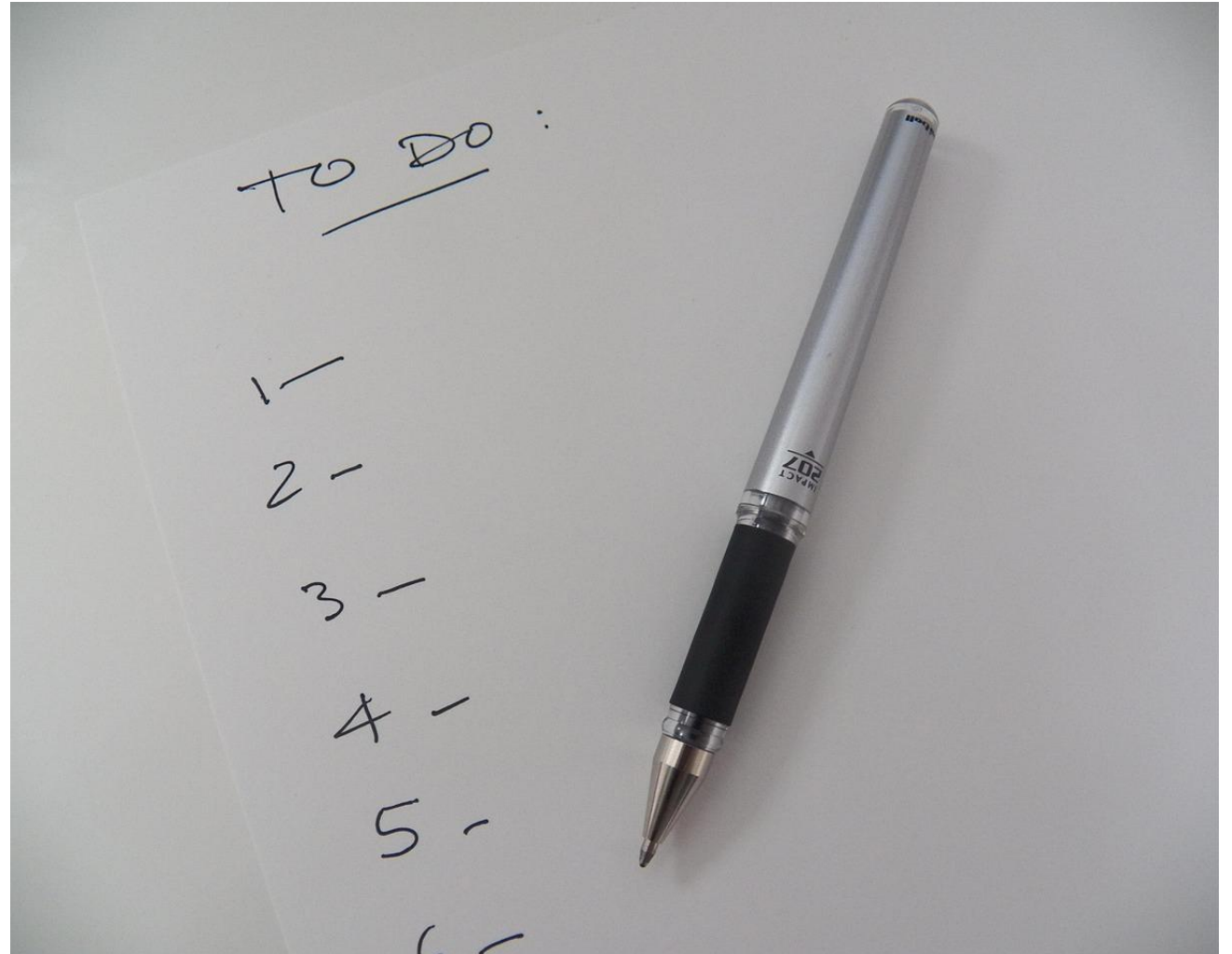
- You may arrive in the U.S. no more than 30 days before the Program Start Date on your Form I-20. **Check the “Earliest Admission Date”** field in the “Program of Study” section of your I-20 to avoid entering too early.
- **Avoid late arrival.** You should leave yourself as much time as possible to settle into your housing, attend orientations, register for classes, etc. You may arrive no later than your I-20 “Start of Classes” Date.
- Review the [CBP arrival website](#) to prepare for your entry at a U.S. airport.

# Register for a **Full Course of Study (FCS)**

- F-1 students must enroll in a [full course of study](#) (FCS) each Spring and Fall semester.
  - Graduate students must enroll in a **minimum of 9 credits** each semester to meet the FCS minimums.
  - At least **6 of those 9 credits must be in-person or hybrid** (not 100% online).
- Enrollment during the summer session is entirely optional.
  - Students who choose to enroll during the optional summer session are not required to meet the FCS minimums. There are also no restrictions to online enrollment in the summer.
- Your enrollment must be completed and in compliance with the FCS minimums by the end of the Add/Drop period on August 24, 2026 to ensure timely SEVIS (I-20) registration.

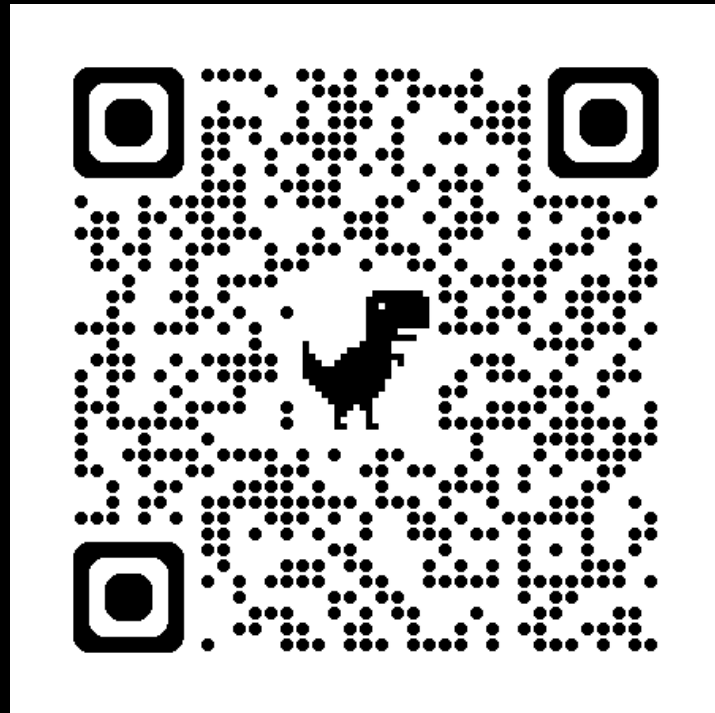

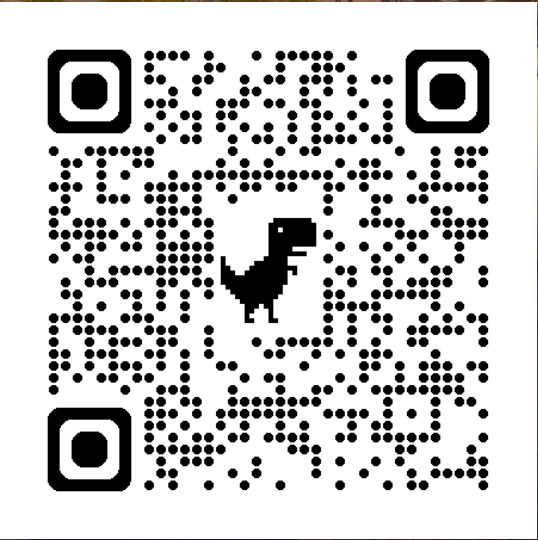
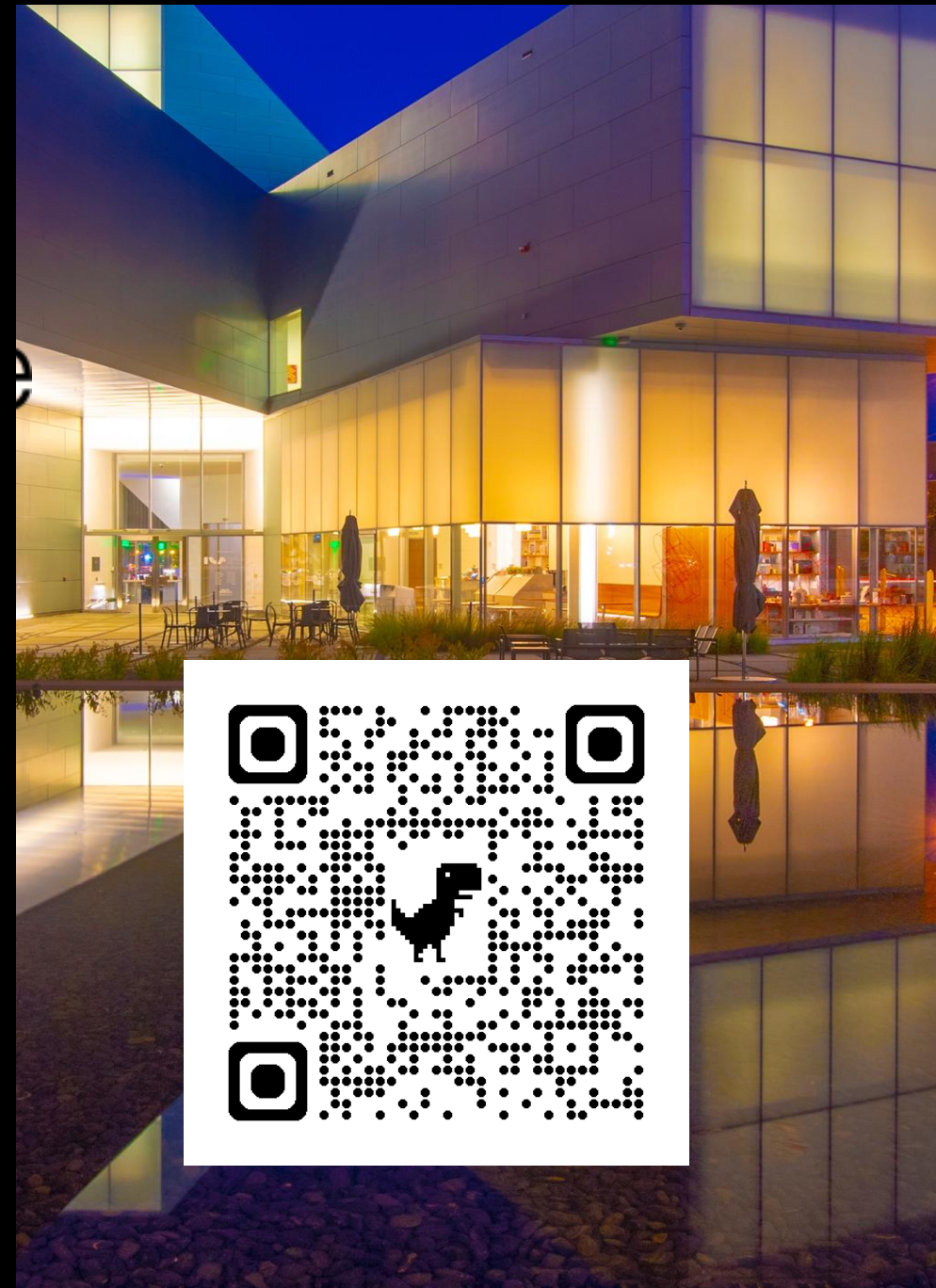

    - No quota
      - “If I attend this number of classes, I do not have to attend additional classes.”
      - This is not common in the United States.
  - Arriving on time
    - Generally expected and considered polite
  - Course syllabi
    - Grading, attendance, AI use, group vs. individual work
  - Academic Performance
    - Minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA – learn more [here](#)
